

Arts and Humanities Submissions: We are requesting submissions of visual art (hand or computer-generated), fiction or non-fiction narrative and poetry. We welcome submissions addressing areas pertinent to general internal medicine (GIM) that may reflect on the challenges of the past year (i.e. COVID-19, recurring consequences of systematic racism, etc.). Submissions will be judged based on overall quality and relevance to GIM.

The arts and humanities submissions selected will be presented at the 2023 Southern SGIM Regional Meeting February 2-4, 2023 in New Orleans, LA and will seek publication in *SGIM Forum*. Individuals will be notified of the status of their submission prior to the regional meeting. All submissions may be released on social media or on the regional SGIM website with proper attribution. Submissions may be reformatted (e.g. resized) to accommodate publication space on electronic messaging/website.

Narrative medicine and poetry submission:

- Maximum word count 1,000 words.
- Please submit as a Word document in double-spaced type, one-inch margins, 12-point Times New Roman.
- Upload your entry to ScholarOne (it will be converted to PDF format) and save your files with your name.

Art submission:

- Original artwork only (hand drawn or computer-generated). Photography submissions are also welcomed.
- Include a brief description (<250 words) discussing how your work of art applies to the meeting theme or the events of 2021-2022.
- Upload two separate files to ScholarOne: one for original artwork and another file for the description. Save your files with your name.
- Artwork must be uploaded as high-resolution JPEG files (High-resolution 300 DPI.)
