This course will introduce several tools and strategies for incorporating AI into clinical practice. It also aims to provide clinicians with tools to use AI and to evaluate the quality and contextual appropriateness of AI tools for patients under their care, judge available information about AI-based tools before applying them for patient care, and understand the role of data in the

function of AI tools. In addition, the social and ethical implications of AI will be addressed to help clinicians make informed decisions about these new and engaging tools.
